Policy Statement

Preface - Code of Conduct

The aim of this Code is to outline the standards of behaviour expected of all students of the School.

This Code does not attempt to provide a detailed and exhaustive list of what to do in every aspect of school life. Instead, it sets out general expectations of the standards of behaviour required.

The Code places an obligation on all students to take responsibility for their own conduct and to work with teachers and staff cooperatively to achieve a consultative and collaborative school culture where students are happy and proud to attend.

Application of how to comply with the Code of Conduct?

By accepting enrolment with the School, you must be aware of and comply with this Code.

Therefore, you must:

- a) conduct yourself, in a manner that upholds the ethos and reputation of the School
- b) comply with the School's policies and procedures
- c) act ethically and responsibly
- d) be accountable for your actions and decisions.

General

This Code is not intended to be contractual in nature and does not impose any contractual obligations on the School. The School reserves the right at its sole discretion to vary or cancel this Code at any time.

Nothing in this Code should be taken to limit the circumstances in respect of which the School may take disciplinary action in respect of a student.

What is expected of you as a student?

- a) be accountable for your attendance, work ethic and social ethic as a student
- b) follow reasonable instructions given by your teacher or other staff
- c) act honestly and in good faith
- d) be courteous and responsive in dealing with your teachers
- e) work collaboratively with your teachers
- f) ensure that your conduct, whether during or outside of school hours, is consistent with the ethos of the School and does not damage the reputation of the School.

What happens if I breach the Code of Conduct?

As a student, you are accountable for your actions.

The consequences of inappropriate behaviour and breaches of this Code will depend on the nature of the breach.

Factors the School may consider when deciding what action to take may include:

- a) the seriousness of the breach;
- b) the likelihood of the breach occurring again;
- c) whether the student has committed the breach more than once;
- d) the risk the breach poses to other students or any others; and



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- e) whether the breach would be serious enough to warrant formal disciplinary action.

Actions that may be taken by the School in respect of a breach of the Code include disciplinary action ranging from a warning to termination of your enrolment contract. The school will reserve the right to determine in its entirety the response to any breach of this Code.

Respect for people

The school expects students to treat each other with respect and courtesy. Our daily interaction with others reflects on the school's reputation. Therefore, all students are expected to be approachable, and courteous. Rude or insulting behaviour, including verbal and non-verbal aggression, abusive, threatening, intimidating or derogatory language and physical abuse or intimidation towards other students or staff is unacceptable. You must not use information and communication technologies, such as email, mobile phones, text or instant messaging, blogs, social media sites and other websites to engage in this type of behaviour.

You must not discriminate against, or harass for any unlawful reason, or bully for any reason any student or staff member. Your obligations in this regard, including the list of unlawful reasons, may constitute an offence under state or federal discrimination legislation.

Relationships with students

You must not have a romantic or sexual relationship with another student. It is irrelevant whether the relationship is homosexual or heterosexual, consensual or non-consensual or condoned by parents or caregivers. You are reminded of:

- a) the law prohibiting sexual relations with a person under the age of consent (16 years); and
- b) the law prohibiting sexual relations between a teacher and their student under the age of 18 years.

Please note that all employees have mandatory reporting obligations where they have reasonable grounds to suspect a child under the age of 18 years is at risk of significant harm and have current concerns about the safety, welfare and wellbeing of the child. You should refer to the School's [Child Protection Policy] for further information about these obligations.

Appropriate use of electronic communication and social networking sites

Any individual teacher is permitted to ask for all student mobile phones to be handed in at the beginning of a lesson.

The school provides electronic communication facilities for its students for educational or administrative purposes. It monitors and views data stored or transmitted using the school's facilities. By its nature, electronic communication is a fast and informal way of communicating. However, once a document or image has been sent there is no way to recall it and it exists forever.

You must never use the School's networks to view, upload, download or circulate any of the following materials:

- a) sexually related or pornographic messages or material;
- b) violent or hate-related messages or material;
- c) racist or other offensive messages aimed at a particular group or individual;
- d) malicious, libellous or slanderous messages or material; or
- e) subversive or other messages or material related to illegal activities.



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Appropriate use of personal electronic communication and social networking sites and devices

Use of personal devices such as a mobile phone to take photographs of staff or students of Wadja Wadja High School is prohibited. In extreme cases of this the student may chose to report to the police.

Use of alcohol, drugs and tobacco

Work Health and Safety is of fundamental importance to the School. Maintaining a safe environment requires everyone's continuous cooperation.

You are responsible for ensuring your capacity to attend and learn is not impaired by the use of alcohol or drugs and that the use of such substances does not put at risk you or any other person's health and safety.

As a School student, you must:

- a) not attend school or a school function including dances, farewells, excursions, sporting fixtures and fund raising events under the influence of alcohol, illegal drugs or non-prescribed and/or restricted substances.
- b) not consume alcohol, illegal drugs or non-prescribed and/or restricted substances while at school or a school function including dances, farewells, excursions, sporting fixtures and fund raising events.
- c) notify your teacher if you are aware that your conduct could be adversely affected as a result of the effect of a prescribed drug;
- d) have illegal drugs in your possession while at school or a school function including dances, farewells, excursions, sporting fixtures and fund raising events. Any illegal drugs found on School property or in the possession of any person on school property may result in disciplinary action including the termination of your enrolment and referral to the Police;
- e) give other students or employees illegal drugs or restricted substances, or encourage or condone their use; and supply or administer prescription or non-prescription drugs to other students unless authorised to do so.
- f) You must not smoke or permit smoking in any School buildings, enclosed area or on School grounds. This includes all buildings, gardens, sports fields, cars and car parks.
 - a) You must not purchase tobacco or tobacco products for any School student, or give them tobacco or tobacco products
 - b) You must not purchase alcohol for, or give alcohol to, another School student (or to any other person under the age of 18 years); and
 - g) You must not encourage or condone the use of alcohol by students of any age during educational activities
